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## Headteacher's news:

Earlier this week, the National Education Union (NEU) announced that its ballot of teacher members in England has met the thresholds required to commence industrial action. The NEU has announced national and regional action in England on the following dates:

- Wednesday 1 February 2023: all eligible members in England and
- Tuesday 28 February 2023: all eligible members in the following English regions: Northern, North West, Yorkshire & The Humber.
- Wednesday 1 March 2023: all eligible members in the following English regions: East Midlands, West Midlands, Eastern.
- Thursday 2 March 2023: all eligible members in the following English regions: London, South East, South West.
- Wednesday 15 March 2023: all eligible members in England and Wales.
- Thursday 16 March 2023: all eligible members in England and Wales.

There are up to 4 days in the list above where teachers may choose to strike and which could result in classes being closed. I will share the details of any disruption to school as soon as I have them but would like you to understand that whilst employers can ask their employees in advance if they intend to strike, employees are not required to tell their employers whether they intend to follow industrial action.
